Gospel

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" - which is translated Christ. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" - which is translated Peter.

We are so often in the role of Andrew – bringing our brothers and sisters to meet the Lord. Together we teach each other to understand what discipleship means and how to develop our relationship with Jesus Christ. We pray: Lord Jesus, Lamb of God, guide my words and actions so that everyone I meet might know you as the Christ.
